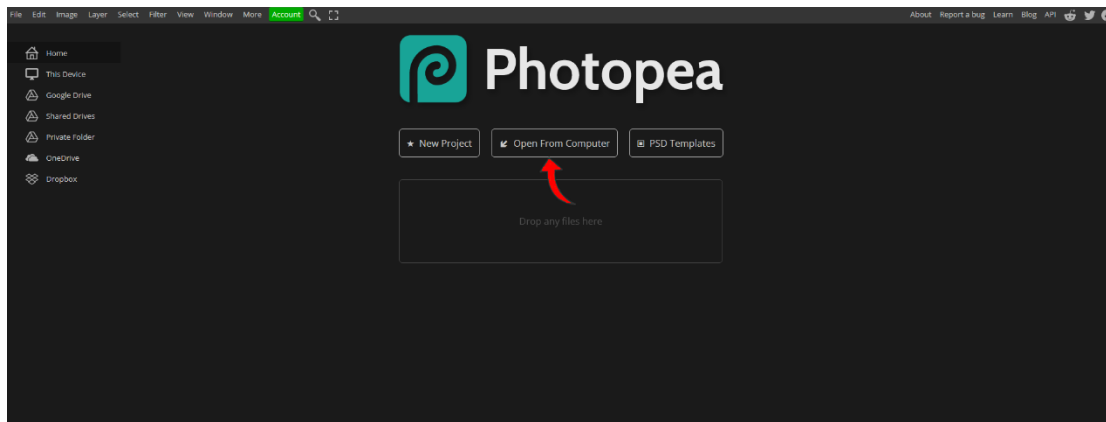
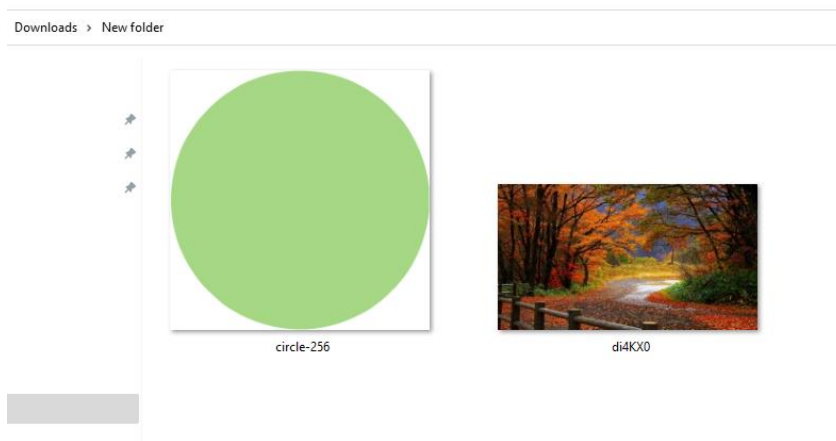


How to insert an image into a shape

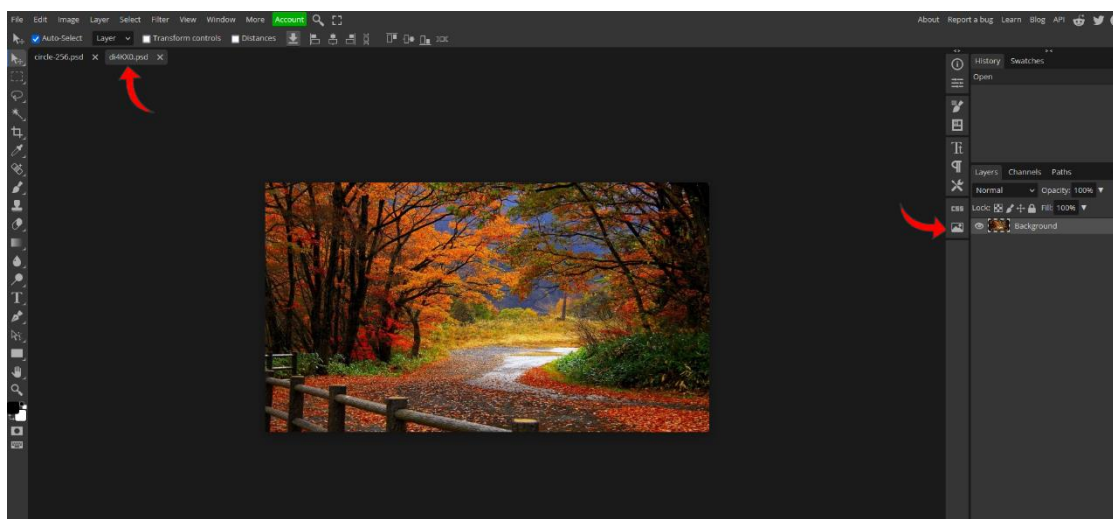
Save the circle and background image to your computer.



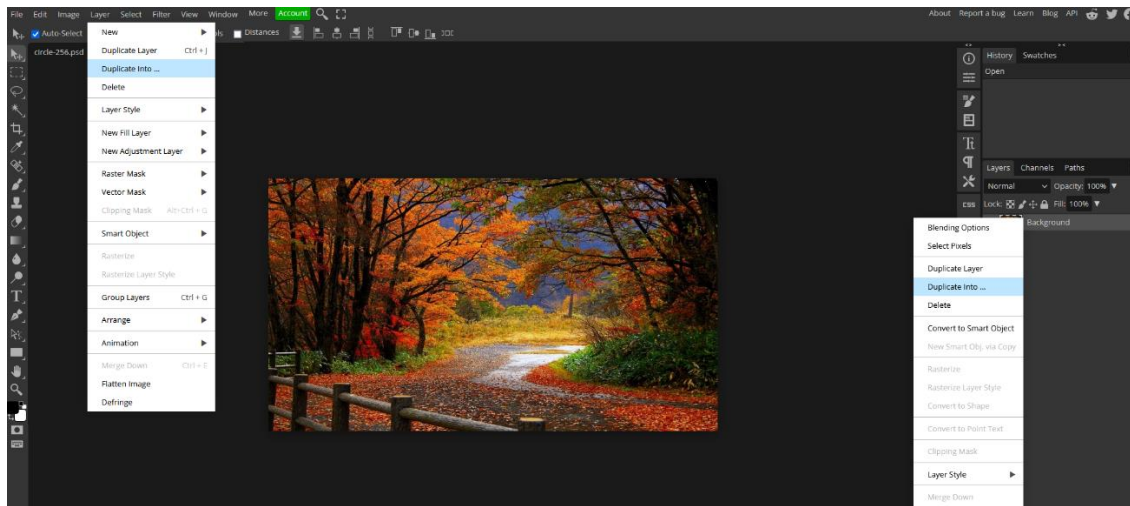
1. Click on the Open from computer button.



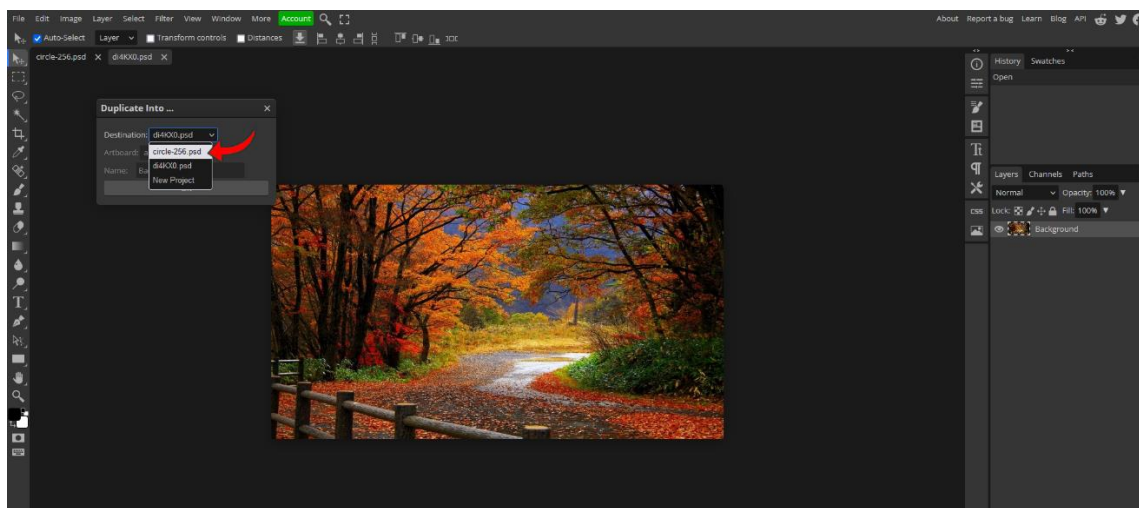
2. Go to the folder where you saved the circle and background image. Click on both images and they will now open in Photopea.



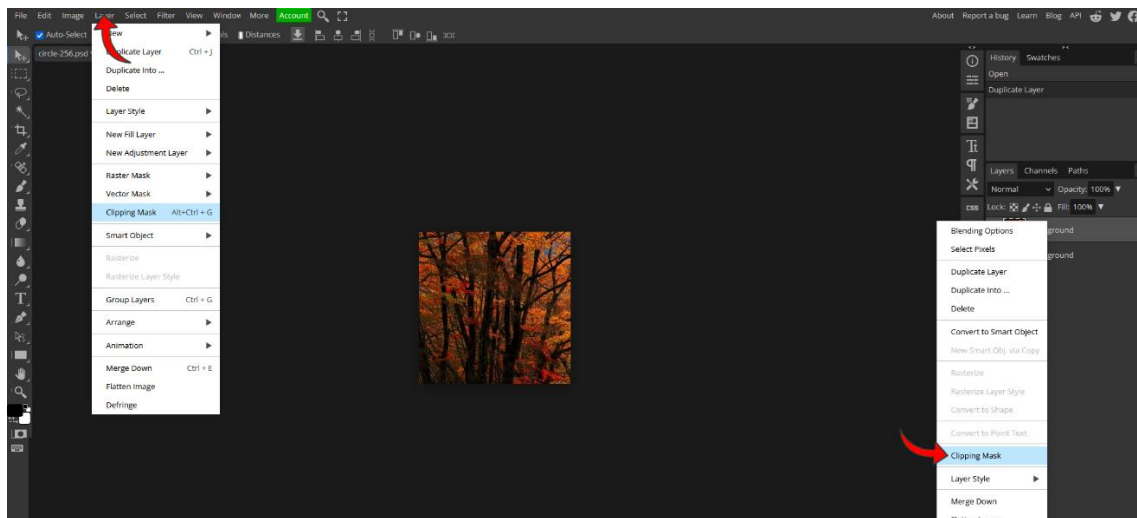
3. To add the background into the circle make sure that you are on the background image. You will now be either right clicking on the layer to add it to the circle if you are on a computer or clicking on the Layer tab on top if you are using a mobile device.



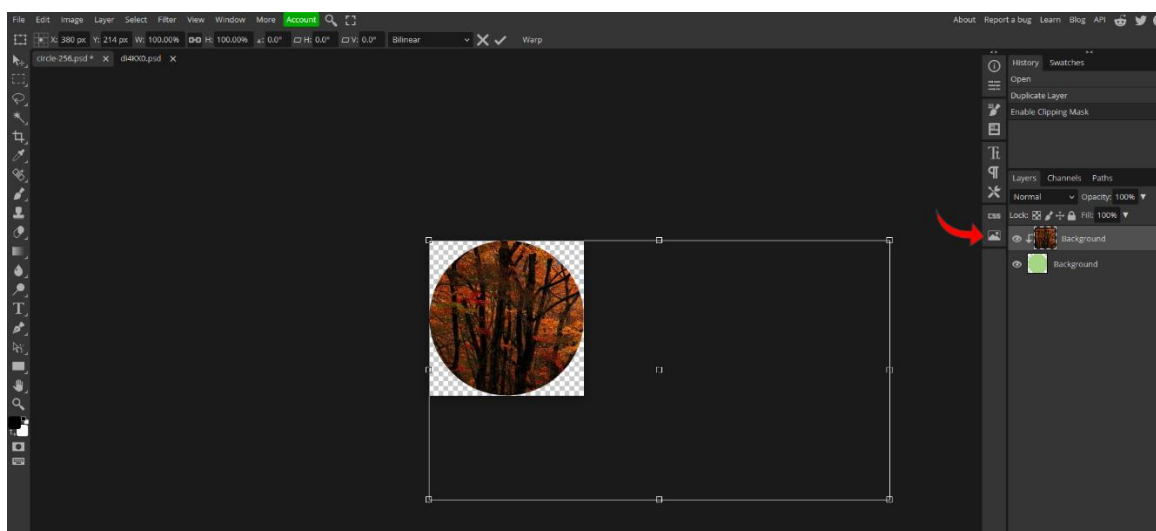
4. For both PC and mobile click on Duplicate Into and a box will pop up.



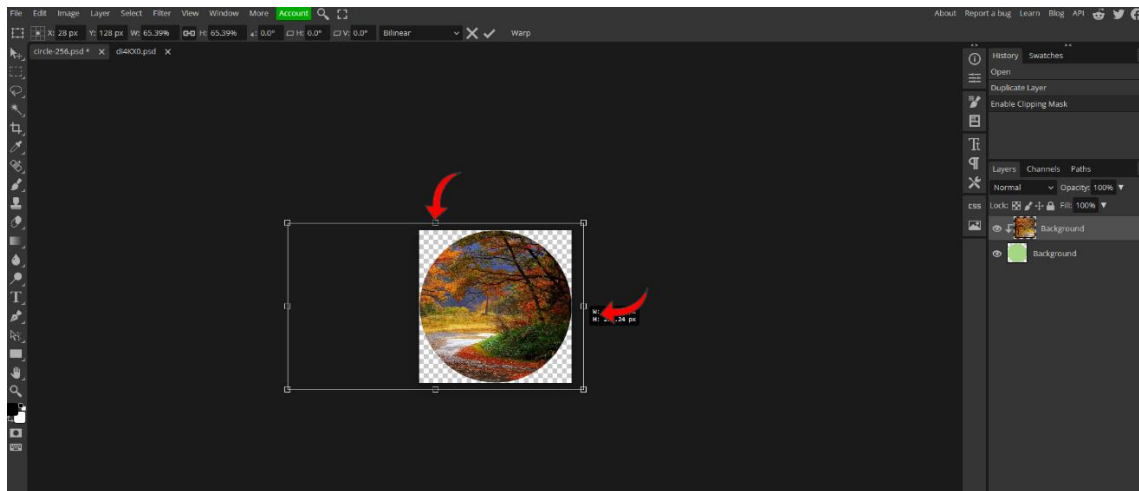
5. Click on the circle-256.psd and then click on OK.



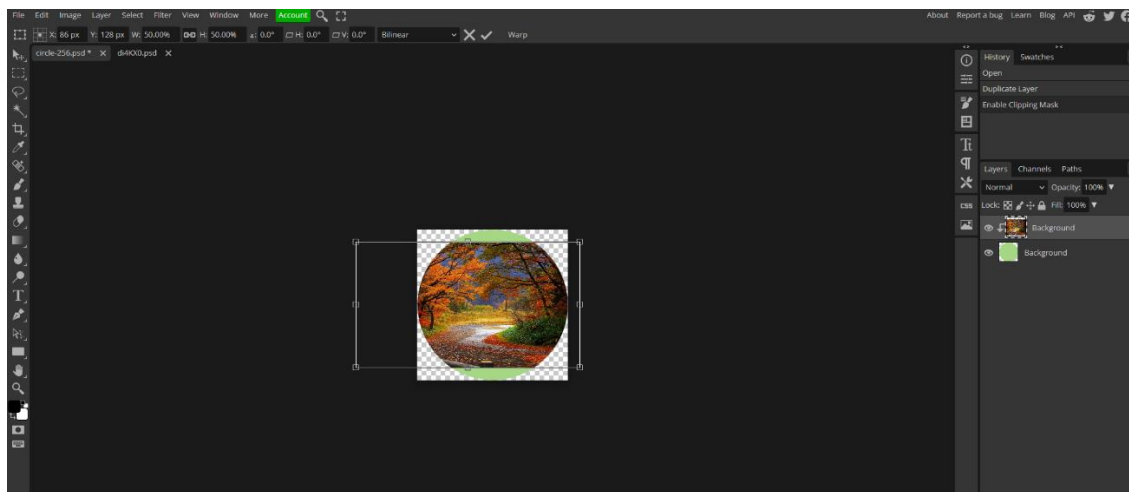
6. As you can see the background is covering the circle. Right click on the layer (PC) or go up to the Layer tab on top and click on Clipping Mask.



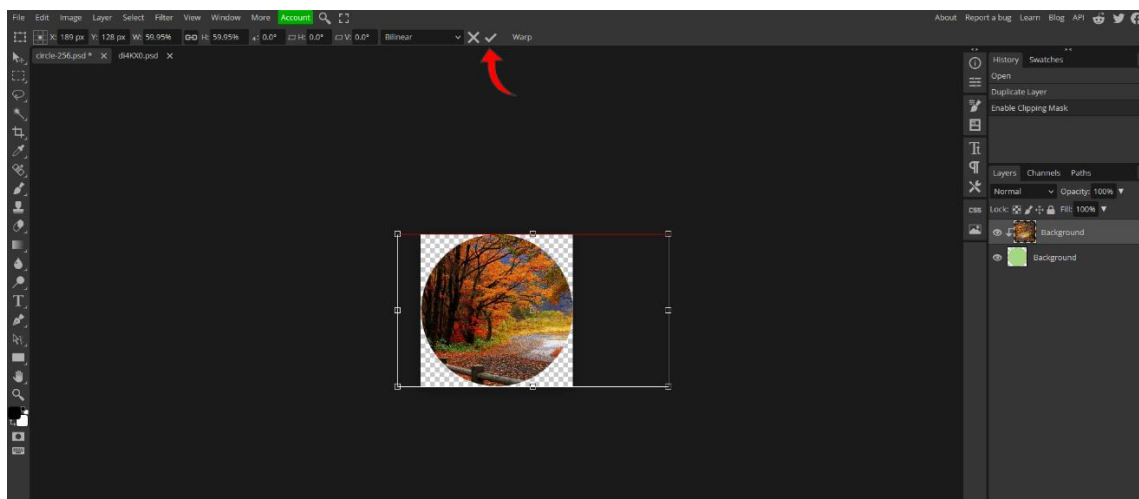
7. Click on CTRL + ALT + T to get a rectangle shape surrounding the circle.



8. Move either the side or the top by bringing it closer to the circle.

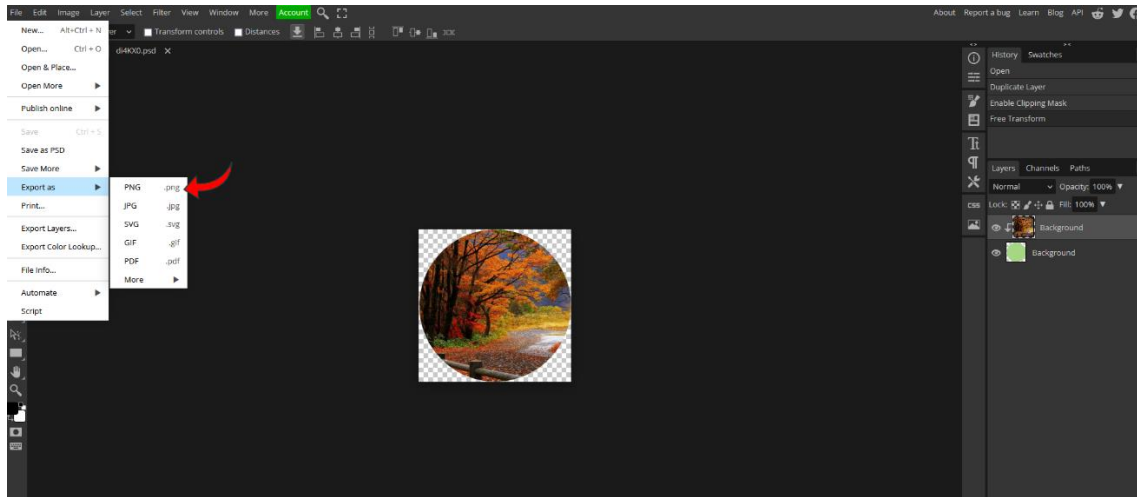


9. If you reduced it too much a part of the green circle will be showing. Click on the top or bottom and bring it out to cover the green area.

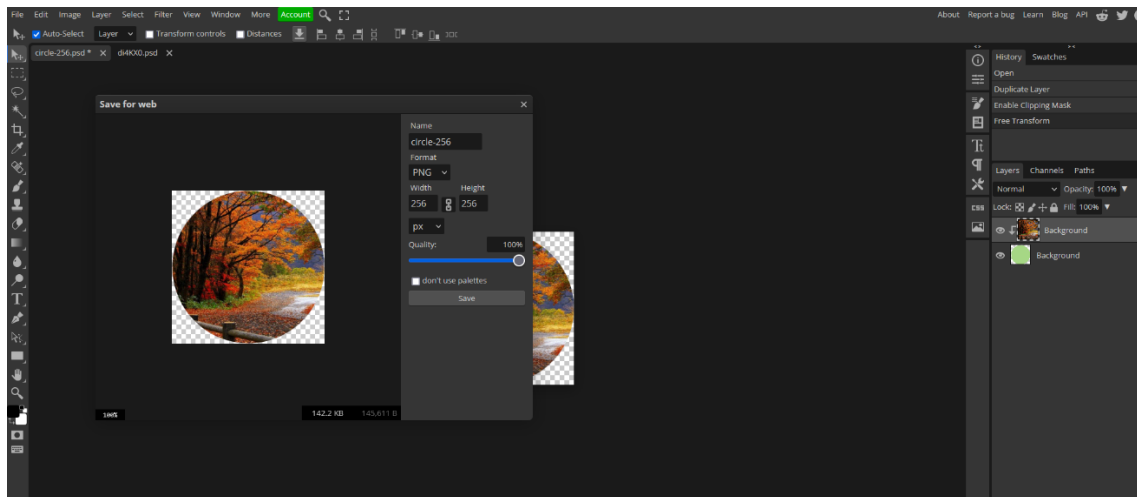


10. Move the image to the left or right until you reach the desired location for your circle. Click on the check mark on top.

Its now time to save this image.



11. Click on File → Export as → PNG. Always save your images as a PNG which will be with a transparent background. A pop up box will open.



12. Give your project a name by clicking on the black space under Name: . You have the option of resizing it but for this project it's not necessary to change the size. Click on the Save button and you're done!
